

In many ways, the 2020-21 school year was a test of our own trust in Christ. It seemed that as soon as plans were made for the year, circumstances would change requiring us to make new plans. For example, the teachers and staff at both schools worked hard throughout the summer of 2020 to prepare for an in-person opening to the school year, only to have it all thrown into chaos as the state released new metrics for remote and hybrid learning. Yet, in the midst of the significant challenges during the past year, God was especially present to our schools, particularly through the cooperation and support of our community.

When the seventy were sent out with no purse, bag, or sandals, they were forced to rely upon the generosity of those whom they encountered along the way. In a similar way, we at the Walla Walla Catholic Schools rely on the generosity and support of others. Support has been given from our community in the form of prayer, offers of assistance, flexibility, adaptability, financial generosity, and more. All of this allowed the WWCS to provide continuous in-person full day instruction for the entirety of last year at our primary grades and the majority of the year for all other grade levels, all while maintaining a healthy and safe school environment for our students and staff.

As the Gospel of Luke continues, "the seventy returned with joy, saying, 'Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!'" (Luke 10:17). During this last year, it feels like all of us have been fighting with various metaphorical demons, and perhaps even literal ones. While the fight continues, I am grateful for the ways in which the efforts of our Walla Walla Catholic Schools have assisted our students, staff, and families in that battle.


we moved into track, golf, baseball, and softball, then we finished the year with basketball and winter cheer.





A Message from the School Board Chair




